Adult Mental Health First Aid Course offered in West-Prince in May

DEBLOIS, PEI, May 11, 2018 – The PEI French Health Network is pleased to announce that an adult mental health first aid course will be offered. The Mental Health Commission of Canada certifies instructors, who then offer mental health first aid courses across Canada. A basic 12-hour course will be offered in French on May 22, 24, 28 and 31, from 5:45 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. at the Community School Center in Deblois. Colette Arsenault will facilitate it.

This course provides participants with the tools they need to offer initial assistance to those struggling with a mental illness such as depression, anxiety, psychosis, substance abuse, and suicidal behaviours. The purpose of the course is not to train people to become therapists. It rather shows how to recognize the signs and symptoms of mental health problems, offer initial assistance, and help people get the help they need.

The PEI French Health Network will cover registration fees. Participants will obtain a manual, and their certification will be good for three years. They must attend all sessions to obtain their certification.
