## Seat for Prince Edward Island in University of Sherbrooke medical program

**WELLINGTON**, **PEI**, **December 3**, **2016** – The PEI French Health Network is reminding Francophone and immersion students of Prince Edward Island interested in studying medicine that every year, the University of Sherbrooke reserves a seat for an Island student.

Through an agreement between the governments of New Brunswick and Quebec, various health programs in select Quebec universities have seats available for Francophone students from New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island. To be eligible, students must first meet the admission criteria of the applicable programs.

Under the agreement, a seat is reserved in the medical program at the University of Sherbrooke only, for one Prince Edward Island student. The agreement also provides for reduced tuition fees. If there are no applications from PEI for the medical program, applications to other health programs may be considered.

Applications must be submitted to the person in charge of special programs at the University Of Moncton Faculty of Science. The deadline for submitting an application is January 13, 2017.
