PEIFLHN launches Santé Bonjour! campaign to increase access to French language health services in PEI

WELLINGTON, **PEI** – **May 2**, **2014** – To increase access to French language health services in Prince Edward Island, the PEI French Health Network (PEIFHN) is launching a campaign to encourage workers who are able to provide services in French to get their name listed in the Network's health service directory. They will receive a free shirt with the *Bonjour!* logo, promoting the active offer of services among their clientele.

Bilingual workers can register on the PEIFHN website at www.santeipe.ca/repertoire. The Francophone community is in turn invited to refer to the directory which already has over 100 entries, to see which services are available and in which areas they can be found.

The PEIFHN recently signed a partnership agreement with three professional health bodies to help the Francophone population of Prince Edward Island find Francophone health providers who can address their needs. In signing these agreements, those bodies expressed their commitment to providing quality health care to French speaking Islanders.

It is also through these agreements that each professional body commits to communicating with its members to determine their ability to offer French language services and encourage them to be listed in the directory. The PEIFHN anticipates signing more agreements with other professional bodies in the upcoming months.
